- 1. Randy started the meeting off by discussing the need for creating a duties list for each officer position.
- 2. Financial and Membership:

- 3. **Name badges**: Herm reported buying mailers (\$5) and checking postage \$1.89 for mailing badges. Dick recommended cheaper mailers available at Walmart.

4. Website changes:

- The Tech/Repair Info page was approved. Vicki will contact Steve about replacing the Links page with this new one.
- Larry noted that the revised membership form needs to be added. Vicki also reported that the Events page needs to be updated. Randy will contact Steve about these items. There was a brief discussion on how to best let Steve know about new events and changes.

5. Car Show:

- a. Food trucks will be available at the show. Electricity can be made available for the food trucks.
- b. We will receive leases for 2024-2026 with 10% increase.
- c. There was a brief discussion about how to increase spectators. Several ideas were raised. Randy will ask club members for volunteer(s) to coordinate the show's outreach activities.

6. Activities:

- **Dust off your cars:** Drive to Shipshewana on **April 22**. Dick is trying to pull together Eastern region members. He asked if there was a place in Shipshewana that they could meet up with others. Randy recommended a public parking lot near the Mercantile building.
- **Spring drive**: PJ confirmed the tram availability at Meijer's gardens.

Gingerman Vintage Racing, May 6 & 7

There is a great opportunity coming up for any Michiana Brits that want to experience a Local Vintage Sports Car Race.

There are 30 or so Vintage Sports Car Groups throughout the US that hold events. Locally VSCDA (Vintage Sports Car Driver Association <u>http://www.vscda.org/</u>) is the dominant club that organizes Vintage Racing in Michigan, Illinois & Wisconsin with 5 races per year. Their opening annual spring race and driver school happens at Gingerman each spring. They have several classes of race cars that will be racing that weekend.

- Production Vintage (typically 1950 through 1960 British Race Cars similar to what you would see at a Brit Car Show including Lotuses and other rarer Brit Cars)

- Historic (Camaros, Mustangs Porsche 911s from the 1970s)
- Formula Cars (Lotus, Cooper, Elva and Formula Vees)

Gingerman Raceway <u>http://www.gingermanraceway.com/</u> is located at 61414 Phoenix Rd South Haven, MI 49090. It was created about 20 years ago and is located in the beautiful South Haven Area near Lake Michigan. This Spring event is particularly beautiful this time of year with the fruit blossoms in the air and the top down. It is an approximately 1 hour away from South Bend. Stan will be there Saturday and Sunday racing his #4 Bug Eye in Group 2. Call him **269-228-0096** and he will try to link up with you.

It usually is \$20 per day to attend (sign in at front gate). If you are wanting to drive your Brit Car Spiritly during the 1 hour lunch break, please let them know at the front gate (usually it is \$50 & requires a technical inspection of your car and removal of any loose items in your car).

Saturday:

- If you would like to lunch time laps with your LBC you need to be there no later than 9:30 so you can register and have your car inspected.

- If you want to observe the races you should expect to be there between 1-6PM
- Banquet is open to public and is usually \$20 for a great barbeque and refreshments

Sunday:

- 9:45 AM Warm up
- AM Sprite Midget Race
- Lunch
- Afternoon Feature Races with new race classes each 1/2 hour
- 4PM party is over
